## PCC AT TAHOE!

At this time, 17 PCC vehicles have been registered for Tahoe. These members will be receiving a series of emails, updating them on our plans for the field entrance check (FEC), PCC seminars and more.

Whether or not you are planning to have your car judged, there is the customary requirement that



all VCCA vehicles on the show field must have an approved fire extinguisher in your vehicle. The following is taken from the VCCA Judging Manual:

**The fire extinguisher must meet current ANSI/UL standards and be rated for a minimum 5 B-C classification. It must pass a pressure check and/or have a gauge reading in the acceptable range and all seals intact.**

In addition, all PCC vehicles are subject to a PCC Field Entrance

Check. This is where the fire extinguisher is checked as well as lights & horn.

If you registered your vehicle in the PCC class, I strongly suggest you look over the Guidelines for PCC Judging and the judging forms on our website: <http://pccvcca.org> under JUDGING INFO.

## WHAT'S NEW IN PCC JUDGING?

Forms! Forms! Forms! Our experience at Carlisle prompted the addition of a PCC Personalization Worksheet to the existing Detailed Judging Form. Although the judging form provides guidelines on what to look for regarding vehicle condition and approximately how many points to deduct, there is no such guidance for adding personalization points—until now! The PCC Personalization Worksheet provides guidance on what modifications to look for and approximately how many


points to add.

Another form was used at Carlisle—the PCC Personalization Summary Form. This form is completed by the owner where a brief list of noteworthy modifications can be provided. This form may be useful to the judges in their assessment of personalization “adder” points.

This will all be discussed at our PCC Judging Seminar at Tahoe. New forms are also posted on our website (<http://pccvcca.org>).
